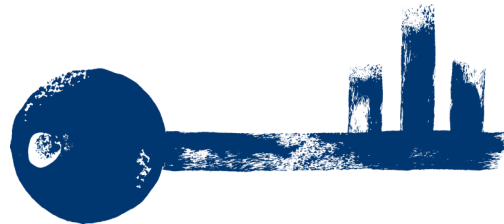
Announcements

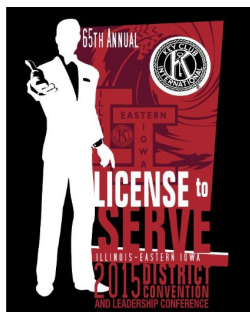


Key Club Fact for April!

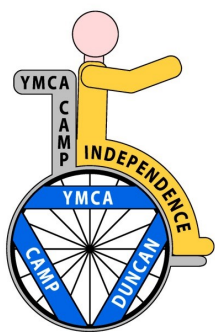


ICON is a great way to find out about new service projects, train for your new leadership role, elect the new international board and discover how your club can help with new charities. You won't want to miss it!
